Don't be blue this September

September has arrived! Holidays are over, children return to school for a new year, and we begin the run down to Christmas! But don't let that make you get the blues! Although that could be appropriate for September is regarded as 'the blue month'. This is because its gemstone is the sapphire, treasured for its rich blue colour. This precious stone is considered to symbolise fidelity and loyalty, and is a favourite for royal engagement rings. The September birth flowers are asters and morning glory – that also mainly appear in hues of blue.

Blue is often regarded as a spiritual colour because it is the colour of the sky, a part of God's creation. Sky blue projects calmness and serenity. In the Bible, the sky is where Heaven is thought to be – not an exact location, but it is somewhere 'up there'. In the book of Exodus, Heaven is described as having a pavement of sapphire stones. In the Middle Ages, clergy liked to adorn themselves with blue sapphires to suggest they were surrounded by Heaven, believing it would help them resist sin and all temptations. Present day clergy like me cannot afford such a luxury, so I shall simply continue to be tempted and to sin!!

In classical works of art, Mary, the mother of Jesus, is traditionally always depicted dressed in blue. Her birthday is September 8th, celebrated by some as a feast day. At St John's we do not mark this occasion, but we do have services every Sunday at 8.30am and 9.45am, which are always celebrations in one sense, and there is also our informal Café Church on 17th of this month at 11.30am, preceded by a 'Community Brunch', to all of which everyone is very welcome. Why not come along too, to the Mother and Toddler Group on Wednesday mornings, the Coffee mornings on alternate Thursdays, and to Aggies to the church led Community Fridge on Wednesdays and the Hub on Thursdays. There are also many other things happening in the village this month, most notably, the Village Fair on Saturday, 16th.

So, there is much to do in Hurst Green in the coming weeks, and so much to enjoy, all of which should help you to ward off any blues that you may experience in this 'blue month'.

Acts from both sides of the Atlantic come to Hurst Green to celebrate Americana

THE
OXTED
SESSIONS

On Sunday 1st October, **The Oxted Sessions** brings five internationally touring artists of the Americana genre (which takes in elements of folk, country and blues) to Hurst Green for 'Americana in the Fall', a one day festival celebrating the genre.

Opening proceedings will be Rod Picott, a stalwart of the Americana scene who has lived in Nashville for over twenty-five years, during which time he has released over a dozen albums, powerfully narrating the blue-collar world he grew up in. Next comes Dietrich Strause, a Boston-based songwriter and multi-instrumentalist, whose combination of gorgeous melody and poetic lyrics has made him a firm favourite on the circuit. The British Americana scene will then get representation from Hatful of Rain. Based in the south-east of England they play a variety of instruments, each taking turns on guitar, banjo, mandolin and double bass, while using a 'single mic' approach in order to capture an intimacy and unity in their songs. Heading into the evening, award winning US singer-songwriter Jesse Terry, whose rich storytelling in his music has earned numerous comparisons to the likes of Jackson Browne, James Taylor and Paul Simon, as well as leading to his music being featured in numerous TV shows, including the popular Netflix series 'Virgin River'. The festival will close with a full band set from Cardiff-based Zervas & Pepper, whose sound mirrors the classic harmony laden folk of the 1960/70s scene, gaining them comparisons to Joni Mitchell and the early stylings of Lindsay Buckingham and Stevie Nicks. They have been played on BBC Radio 2 and BBC 6 music; have supported Deacon Blue on a UK tour; and have been acclaimed by the likes of The Guardian and the prestigious Rolling Stone Magazine.

'Americana in the Fall' is at the Hurst Green Community Centre on Sunday 1st October.

Doors open at 2pm, and the event finishes at 8.30pm. A bar will be available throughout the event, and a food van will be on site for some of the afternoon/evening (exact timings TBC).

Tickets are priced at £25, though there are discounts available for groups and under-26s. Full information and tickets are available at wegottickets.com/oxtedsessions.

An update from Ruben's Fund in his birthday month

Ruben was born on World Heart Day (29 September), but unfortunately died when he was just 3 ½ months old due to dilated cardiomyopathy. There is still a great deal of research to be done into the disease so his family, who live locally and whose grandfather prints the Hurst Green News, set up Ruben's Fund to raise awareness and £200,000 to allow the specialist research team at Royal Brompton to set up a focused and dedicated project to research genetic diagnosis. This will help predict disease course, open avenues for personalised treatment, and have implications for family screening. As most paediatric cardiomyopathy remains genetically unexplained, there is an urgent need to better understand genetic susceptibility and underlying disease mechanisms. Ruben's family said *'If we can help just one baby or child suffering the effects of Cardiomyopathy, by supporting the science to look into this, then this will be our privilege and honour - all in the name of our beautiful baby boy, who impacted so many people in his short life.'*
