OXTED BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT GROUP: Drop in between 1 and 3pm at Oxted United Reformed Church, every other Thursday. Come on your own or with a friend to meet others and discuss ways of coping. It is a friendly and positive gathering where anyone recently or long ago bereaved is welcome to share tea, biscuits and chat in a relaxed environment. Anyone will be sure to feel able to speak or share and be understood. There are usually fewer than a dozen people, and conversation veers from laughter to emotional release that is much appreciated by all. Lesley Bunce, an extremely experienced lay helper sponsored by St Catherine's Hospice, leads the group with volunteers. An initiative of Churches Together in Oxted & District, OBSG meets this month on 4 and 18 January.

LENT CLIMATE PILGRIMAGE: The Rt Revd Dr Martin Gainsborough Bishop of Kingston, lead Bishop for the Environment, is undertaking a pilgrimage over six separate days during Lent 2024 to shine a spotlight on the climate and ecological crisis and to encourage personal and systemic change. Walks will be 5 - 7 miles long, beginning at 10am and finishing around 4.30pm, in different parts of the Diocese on different days, finishing at Southwark Cathedral on 28 March ahead of the Maundy Thursday Chrism Eucharist where pilgrims will be met by Bishop Christopher.

The first walk is in the local area of Reigate and Tandridge on **Saturday 17 February** and will be led by Revd Helen Burnett, Vicar of Chaldon. It is 7 miles long starting at Reigate railway station and ending at Chaldon. Helen is hoping to provide a minibus and driver so those who might struggle with the steeper bits of the route can join in for the gentle bits!
