#### **East Surrey Walkers**

The East Surrey Walkers programme of walks from January to March 2022 is currently being compiled. It's always a good idea to check the programme near a walk date just in case there have been any last minute alterations: www.eastsurreywalkers.org.uk

Many of our walks are based within East Surrey; however we frequently walk in other locations and counties, and in so doing discover points if interest. An example can be found in the Kentish village of Chiddingstone. The clue is in the name of the village: deconstructed it becomes Chiding Stone. Indeed there is such a named stone in the village. The Chiding Stone is situated at the end of a footpath adjacent to the school. It is formed by a large rock of sandstone, formed about 135 million years ago when that part of the country was underwater and swamp like. Folklore plays a significant part in the name of the stone if not the village. Variously, versions include that the stone was used in ancient druid rituals including as a location where judgements were handed down. Similarly that it was used by the ancient Britons as a place to conduct judicial hearings. Possibly it was used as a boundary marker in Saxon times. From the Medieval era, folklore indicates nagging wives, wrongdoers and witches were brought to the stone to be chided by an assembly of villagers. Perhaps a little more prosaically it is said the village name means 'stone of Chidda's tribe'. The Oxford Dictionary of English Place Names indicates that Cidingstaene means a stone associated with someone called Cidd or Cidda.

I'd like to think that aspects of the folklore have some merit but will leave it to the reader to decide. Happy Walking! Stephen Hanks, Publicity Officer

A mileage allowance and extra telephone and parking costs are reimbursed.

#### **Hurst Green Gardening Club**

The December issue of the Hurst Green News revealed many opportunities to participate and share with others, whatever your beliefs may be. This may seem a long way from gardens, but the chance to connect with the natural world is beyond our increasingly technologically-oriented society. As someone without a smart phone, I feel separated from much social activity, but that gives me time to be aware of what surrounds me.

I may not know much about other gardening club members, but meeting together allows us to share what we know, a common interest outside our daily routine. I try to organise speakers who can teach us about gardening, and if you have any suggestions yourself then please let me know. You may already have enjoyed our first meeting on 12 January. I hope it has encouraged you to consider coming again. On 9 February we will find out just what was in the job-description of a Victorian Head Gardener. Many of the gardens near to us may have been the result of their dedication.

#### Winter Wildlife - feed the birds!

Birds are the most noticed visitors to our gardens. Some species such as house sparrows and house martins are declining due to habitat loss and disease, but simple actions can help birds flourish in winter.

You can start by providing a fresh source of water in a bird bath or dish especially in freezing conditions and putting up a bird feeder or table. Understanding food types and feeding habits encourages a variety of species. Don't put out salty food or dry bread which can be harmful for birds, and avoid cooking fats which stick to feathers and harbour bacteria. Whole peanuts are an ideal winter food but pose a choking hazard and should only be provided in a mesh feeder.

Hanging feeders attract most species of tit, greenfinch, goldfinch, and house and tree sparrows. Fill them with a general seed mix that includes energy rich sunflower seed or suet. Fat balls can be made from suet or lard mixed with seed, hung in special fat ball feeders, or smeared into coconut shells and hung on string. Hang feeders out of reach of predators such as cats, not too low or within reach of branches or fences. Blackbirds, song thrushes, collared doves, robins and dunnocks are primarily ground feeders and are best fed from a bird table.

Unlike other birds, the feisty robin can often be heard in winter, even on frosty days. To survive these lean months it must sing to defend its feeding territory from rival robins and will even carry on after the sun has set. More information from www.surreywildlifetrust.org


