Snowdrops

Well, 2022 is Marching on as you read this News. Who knows what the year ahead will bring, but we anticipate with all our hearts that spring will unfold bringing colour and life to the world, renewing our HOPE.

I have been learning about snowdrops. These are already emerging in gardens, woods and in the countryside. The Latin name is Galanthus nivalis - milk flower of the snow. They originated from Europe, and it is said that there are over

2,500 different varieties, 19 wild ones. Certainly, at RHS Wisley Gardens many different types can be seen, some even flowering in autumn. Though they look fragile and humble with downturned heads, they are tough, surviving even in snow. Don't they look magical in huge white drifts like snow in our woodlands!

They are also not just insignificant little flowers. Last year a mail order company in Ipswich was paid £725 for seed of Galanthus woronowii 'Elizabeth Harrison'. This variety has a golden yellow ovary and yellow petal markings!

The bulbs of snowdrops are poisonous and are a good defence against hungry deer grazing on flowers or squirrels digging up bulbs. This perhaps led to superstitions of not allowing snowdrops to be cut and brought inside. However, snowdrops also have a substance in them called galantamine that helps treat the symptoms of Alzheimer's disease. It has been used to treat memory problems since I was born in the 1950s. Perhaps I should investigate this!

More than anything, I am reminded that snowdrops are a symbol of hope and purity, the consolation of coming spring after hard winter and the promise of rebirth. Snowdrops remind us of sympathy for someone struggling. They have three pure white outer petals encircling the inner petals that are notched and usually have green marks. The church in the past has used snowdrops as a reminder that God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit three in one, surround and protect us. Wordsworth wrote a famous sonnet to the humble snowdrop including the lines 'Nor will I then thy modest grace forget, Chaste Snowdrop, venturous harbinger of spring, and pensive monitor of fleeting years.'

Time flies by, especially for those of us who are older. May we, as spring moves into summer, not forget to pause and reflect on God's beautiful creation, holding on to HOPE no matter what the weather.

East Surrey Walkers - a Smuggler's Tale

I have on a number of occasions stated that walking provides not only health benefits but also the opportunity to learn a little local and social history. Please check our walks on our website: www.eastsurreywalkers.org.uk; you may discover some gems.

The village of Godstone is many miles from the coast, so how does it feature in a story of piracy? The link is John Edward Trenchman, a 17th Century pirate Trenchman grew up London's docklands, a thriving port and smugaler. teeming with sailing ships and sailors, many from far off exotic lands. At the age of 12 he ran away to sea and joined the crew of Henry Morgan, the notorious Caribbean pirate. This was not by chance. Trenchman had been inspired by tales of gold and adventure on the Spanish Main. He was involved in many acts of piracy, frequently attacking Spanish ships. Political influences came to the fore and in order to avoid another war with Spain, the Crown took action to eradicate English piracy. Under such pressure Trenchman returned to England. He organised a successful smuggling network establishing a route to bring contraband, using pack horses, from the south east coast to Croydon.

In 1687 a member of Trenchman's gang was arrested after a fight in an ale house, recognised as a smuggler and sent for trial. In order to avoid death by hanging he turned King's evidence and provided information about the smuggling operation run by Trenchman. Customs men and soldiers ambushed the gang at Tilburstow Hill. Shots were fired and only Trenchman managed to escape the scene. However, he had been fatally wounded. He apparently made it to the 'Fox and Hounds' Inn where he died a few hours later.

The villagers of Godstone took pity on the pirate and buried him in an unmarked grave at the south end of the St Nicholas churchyard. It is said that shortly after the burial, two grave diggers were hotly pursued through the churchyard of St Nicholas Church by a man in seaman's clothing, who had leapt up from behind a headstone. Other reports were made by villagers of seeing a spooky figure dressed in seaman's clothing 'haunting' the churchyard. Ultimately the priest and churchwardens decided to re-bury Trenchman with a full Christian service. His grave is marked by a distinctive headstone bearing

skull and crossbones carving. Following the reburial in consecrated ground, there were no more sightings of the figure in seaman's clothing.

Many of our walks begin in Godstone and pass through the churchyard on a public footpath. Trenchman's grave is adjacent to the footpath. Why not join one of the walks and see if you can spot the headstone? It's very distinctive.

Witch Hazel



As a child, if I sustained a bruise, a sprain or a graze, my mother would apply cotton wool soaked in witch hazel. It was comforting, but I was never convinced

that it made me better. The witch hazels are winter flowering, deciduous shrubs of the Hamamelis family, commonly found in gardens. The supposed therapeutic properties originate from the polyphenols extracted from one of the species, but any real benefit has always been disputed.

The plant has no connection with witches, its name comes from an Old English word 'wiche' meaning 'bendable', as their stems were often used for water divining. To me, their curious flowers are one of the delights of winter. Each one comprises four very thin, elongated petals, that have a spidery form, coloured yellow, orange or red depending on the species, and often, a spicy fragrance. Mary Seller

Wildlife to look out for in early spring

The loud percussion of the great spotted woodpecker is one of the first sounds of spring, hammering out its territory on a tree.

Meanwhile badger cubs are born underground. You may see fresh heaps of soil outside sett entrances,

but you won't see the cubs outside yet for a few months. In tree-holes and nest-boxes

tawny owls may already be nesting. Queen bees are among the first insects of the year to be seen on the wing, feeding on winterflowering honey suckle, primroses and pussy willow catkins. The first butterflies of spring are small tortoiseshell, peacock and brimstone.

Look out as they flutter by exploring hedgerows and gardens for early sources of nectar. More info at www.surreywildlifetrust.org
