Station No 1 is 'Release' based on The Earthquake: Matthew 28: 2-4. You will see this in the church grounds as you enter from the road looking towards the church. Further stations will be revealed over the next few weeks, the final one being in time for Pentecost (5 June) and entitled 'For All'.

Michael was a talented pianist, organist, accompanist and performer who led the choir for 33 years. Under his direction he enthused both singers and audiences with his love for music, producing outstanding concerts. His musical accomplishments included composing pieces especially for the choir and he was much loved and admired by its members for his patience and kindness.

The Summer Concert will feature a selection of contrasting pieces including Rutter's Requiem, Faure's Cantique de Jean Racine and Haydn's Te Deum plus one of Michael Barlow's last compositions, Two Shakespeare Songs, written for the Hurst Green Singers and performed at his farewell concert in May 2018.

The performance will be held in the Bawtree Hall, Hazelwood School, Wolfs Hill, Limpsfield, Surrey RH8 0QU on Saturday 14 May at 7.30pm. James M Meaders will conduct the choir of over 65 singers including soloist Laura Fowler accompanied by a chamber orchestra.

Criminal Damage to Vehicles

Tandridge Safer Neighbourhood Team is aware of concerns within the local community around criminal damage to vehicles. We would like to reassure you that this is not a crime trend we are seeing in Hurst Green, but wanted to offer some crime prevention tips.

Criminal damage to vehicles is often committed by thieves trying to get into a vehicle to steal something from inside. This can range from phones or sat navs to loose change or even umbrellas. You can lower the risk to your vehicle by making sure all valuables are removed when you park up. If you cannot take items out, please lock them away out of sight in the boot or glove box. Leaving items such as your sat nav holder or phone charging cable on display can be enough for a thief to take their chances and try breaking into your car, so make sure these are hidden too.

In the case of vandalism, there isn't a great deal that can be done to prevent someone from damaging your vehicle other than parking it off the street in a secure place, like on a private driveway or in a garage. We know that this isn't realistic for everyone, so please ensure your car alarm is working and you park as close to your property as possible. You can also consider investing in CCTV for your front door or driveway, to act as a deterrent or to provide vital evidence if your car is then damaged.
