SYLVIA RUSSELL RIP: We all have been shocked and saddened by the sudden death of our dear friend, Sylvia Russell. A really lovely person who was quiet and unobtrusive, Sylvia has been a regular worshipper with us for many years. She was a talented lady who was most interesting to talk to, and one who had strong opinions on most matters. She had been a nurse, and had worked at the old Oxted Hospital - of blessed memory - and would recount happenings from her time there. She had a rich and blessed marriage to John, but that was sadly ended by his early death while she was still at the hospital.

Sylvia's faith was strong, and her place in the very last row of the north aisle, Sunday by Sunday, was a reassuring presence. She was a gifted flower arranger, and a stalwart of our flower arranging team. When they had an especially long session preparing the church for a major festival, Sylvia always brought a newly baked cake to sustain them in their task. She had a friendly interest in what I was growing in my garden, and might tell me that I should dig something up because she did not like it, or I should move it because it would be better placed elsewhere!

Several of us knew that she was somewhat unwell before Christmas, but, typically, not wanting a fuss, she passed it off as 'just having some tests'. In fact, she was seriously ill, and her end came rapidly on 11 January. How we shall miss her! We thank God for all that she brought to us, and shared with us. May she rest in peace and rise in glory. We extend our love and condolences to her brother, Denis, and her niece, Sarah. Sylvia's funeral will be held at St John's on Tuesday 17 February at 11am, followed by cremation at the Bluebell cemetery. *Mary Seller*

THE SEASON OF LENT: Lent begins on 18 February, Ash Wednesday, and the 22 February is the first Sunday of Lent. PLANS FOR THE FUTURE OF ST JOHN'S: The mission day on 17 January, attended by 16 people, was creative and productive, with a variety of ideas emerging. These involve activities aimed at building and strengthening relationships and connections, both with other church members and the local community, and making St John's Church more visible. The Parochial Church Council (PCC) met on 22 January and discussed how to take these suggestions forward. Communication was a common theme.

Plans include repeating the successful beer and chilli evening and quiz night; open air service in June/July on the green by Aggies or in the churchyard; advertising St John's events in Oxted Local; Church open day; inviting a Gospel choir; slot on Radio Surrey; after service coffee at the back of the church; youth outreach; and strengthening the relationship with The Diamond Pub, starting with a ladies' meal and men's drinks. **WATCH THIS SPACE!**

NEW CABINET: Organised by the Crossing the Threshold group, this has now arrived and is in the church. It will replace the table used previously and is on wheels so it can be moved to clear a space for other activities. It also provides ample storage space.

FROGS AND TOADS: The migration season for our local frogs and toads will soon be upon us again. This is when they make their move to and from the pond where they were bred. It's weather-dependent because they are cold-blooded and won't usually venture out if the temperature feels like less than 5 °C. A mild, damp evening is ideal. Please drive carefully in the hours after sunset during February and March on the stretches of road leading to the T-junction between Church Way and Oast Road, and if you would like to help the Toad Patrol in keeping casualties to a minimum please contact Adrian on 07974 171977.
